- 1) Berowaldus, made a great figure in the reign of King Malcolm IV, died after 1162
- 2) John, who lived in the reign of King William, died after 1165
- 3) Walter de Innes, died after 1233
- 4) Sir Alexander de Innes, succeeded his father 1249
- 5) William, died after 1298
- 6) William de Innes, died after 1330
- 7) Robert de Innes, died after 1371
- 8) Alexander Innes, died after 1393
- 9) Sir Robert Innes, married Janet Aberkerder, daughter and heiress of Sir David, thane of these lands
- 10) Sir Walter de Innes. Married Eupham Frasser, daughter of Hugh, first Lord of Lovat
- 11) Isabel Innes, married James Dunbar, fifth Earl of Murray, John died 1448
- 12) Sir Alexander Dunbar, married Isabel, daughter of Alexander Sutherland
- 13) Sir James Dunbar, second Baron of Westfield, Sheriff of Murray, married Eupheme, daughter of Patrick Dunbar, Sir James died in 1505
- 14) Sir James Dunbar, heretable Sheriff of Murray, married Elizabeth, daughter of Sir James Ogilvie of Deskford, Sir James died in 1535
- 15) Sir Alexander Dunbar, of Westfield, called "The Bold Sheriff", married (2) Janet, daughter of John Leslie of Park Hill
- 16) Margaret, married Robert Munro, fourteenth Baron of Foulis
- 17) Robert Munro, fifteenth Baron of Foulis, married (1) Margaret Ogilvy, daughter of the family of Finlater, Died November 4<sup>th</sup>, 1588
- 18) Hector Munro of Foulis, married Anne, daughter of Hugh, sixth Lord of Frazer of Lovat, Hector died November 14<sup>th</sup>, 1603
- 19) Sir Hector Munro of Foulis, married the daughter of Hugh MacKay of Farre, Sir Hector died in Hamburg, Germany in 1635
- 20) Catherine Munro of Foulis, married (2) Norman Denune, Esq. who inherited all his fathers virtues, but little or none of his estate.
- 21) Mr. William Denune, second son of the first Norman, a man of parts and learning, and being bred to the church, was minister of the gospel at Pencaitland, in East Lothian, where he married Isabella, daughter of Doctor George Hepburn of Moncraig, Esq; by Helen his wife, daughter of sir Alexander Swinton of that ilk, and by her he had one son, George; and several daughters, 1) Christian, married to James Hepburn Congalton Esq; chief of the ancient family of the Congaltons of that ilk in East Lothian, without issue, 2) Mariamne, married to sir John Bruce-Hope of Kinross, baronet, by whom she had one son, John, who died in infancy, and a daughter, Anne Bruce-Hope of Arnot, who is now heir of line of the Hopes of Craighall, Bruces of Kinross, &c. Mr. William's other daughters died unmarried.
- 22) Dr. William Alexander Denune, the earliest southern colonial portrait painter, born 1699 in Scotland, graduated from medical school in Paris France in 1721, married Elizabeth Duvall, November 24, 1728, daughter of Mareen Duvall the younger and Elizabeth Jacob of Prince George County, Maryland
