 not here at more length propork and therefore the said Lord Gifford Heyburne  
 is only Executor & Devisee as creditor for payde his sachsion to her  
 of the ordinar rent and profit of the said Summ of vij aij marks of all  
 years & termes bygone resting owing since the Decease of his said  
 Lord husband And sullyke yearly and termely in hme coming during  
 all the days of her lifetime after the forme and tenor of the forand contract  
 of marriage in all points lyk as for payde sachsion to her of the  
 charges and expenses of confirmation of this present testament In her  
 favor the said Defunt his gooddears Deith underrim will extend to  
 and as may be recovered to the said Executor prop and that by Decree of
